EMPEROR AGREES TO PUNISHMENTS TO MINISTER CONGR NOTIFIES WASHINGTON TO THIS EFFECT.

Washington, Feb. 21.—A cablegram from Minister Conger states the Chinese emperor agrees to all the punishments named in Mr. Conger's telegram of February 6.

Washington, Feb. 21.—It is yet uncertain whether Minister Conger's message marks the passage of this important phase of the Chinese question relative to punishments and the taking up of the questions of indemnity and guarantee.

Pekin, Feb. 21.—Prince Ching and Li Hung Chang (Chinese peace commissioners) have received telegraphic instructions from the court to notify the ministers of the powers that an edict has been issued regarding the punishment of the Chinese officials in conformity with the demands made by the ministers as follows:

London, Feb. 21.—The British government is without any further official explanation of Field Marshal Count von Waldersee's action in planning an expedition to Pekin in China.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 21.—The news correspondent here has excellent authority for the statement that Count von Waldersee's expedition will not start as it is believed a decree will be published in Pekin today accepting the terms of the minister.

BOERS IN GREAT DISTRESS SET FREE ONCE MORE

London, Feb. 21.—A Pretoria special of the 20th says 100 Boers passed Pretoria yesterday moving in the direction of Nyatrom Point, 75 miles north of Pretoria and on the railroad between Pretoria and Pietersburg.
